THE PURIFICATION OFFERING

Pastor: Let us call upon God's mercy.



Pastor: Dearly beloved brethren, if we say we have no sin, we deceive ourselves and the truth is not in us, but if we confess our sins, God, who is faithful and just, will forgive our sins and cleanse us from all unrighteousness. As a father pities his children, so the Lord pities those who fear him; for he knows our frame and remembers that we are dust. Accordingly, the Scriptures call upon us in many places to acknowledge and confess our great iniquity before the throne of grace. Let us humbly kneel and confess our sins together.

CONFESSION OF SIN: (Kneeling if able.)

O Lord Jesus Christ, looking on You whom we have pierced, we mourn for our sins of thought, word, and deed which we are always committing against Your holy majesty and which made necessary Your suffering and death for our salvation; we have not loved You with all our heart nor humbly served one another as You have served us. In the midst of our earthly comforts, we have forgotten the pains and mortal anguish that You endured for our salvation.

Lamb of God, who takes away the sins of the world, have mercy upon us and forgive our sins. Grant us a deeper understanding of all that You suffered, in Your betrayal, Your lonely agony, Your false trial, Your mocking and scourging, and the torture of Your death upon the cross. As You have given Yourself utterly for us, may we give ourselves entirely to You, O Jesus Christ, our only Lord and Savior. Amen.

Pastor: Arise and hear the good news of God's forgiveness!

DECLARATION OF ABSOLUTION

Pastor: Hear God's sure and trustworthy promise: Almighty God, the Father of our Lord Jesus Christ, who desires not the death of a sinner, but rather that he may turn from his wickedness and live, has committed the ministry of reconciliation to his Pastors, giving them power and commandment, to declare and pronounce to his repentant people the absolution and remission of their sins. Thus, in the name of the crucified and risen Savior, I declare to you: All your sins have been fully and freely pardoned. Go and sin no more! May God grant you his Holy Spirit that you may do only those things that please him, and at the last day, enter into his eternal joy; through Jesus Christ our Lord. Amen!





Pastor: The peace of the Lord be with you!


People: And also with you!
